Foundation 1

Autumn 1 - Nursery Rhyme Focus

Autumn 2 - Phase 1, Aspects 1-3 (Environmental Sounds, Instrumental Sounds, Body Percussion)

Spring 1 - Review Phase 1, Aspects 1-3, add in Aspects 4-5 (Rhythm and Rhyme, Alliteration)

Spring 2 - Review Phase 1, Aspects 1-5

Summer 1 - Review Phase 1, Aspects 1-5, add in Aspects 6-7 (Voice Sounds, Oral Segmenting)

Summer 2 - Review Phase 1, Aspects 1-7 with a greater focus on Oral Segmenting. Introduce some early Phase 2 letter sounds if children are ready.
