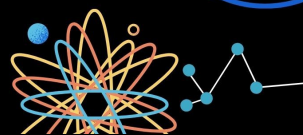


Our Year 6 Science Ambassadors went to an exciting science show run by Ian Russell from Interactives!

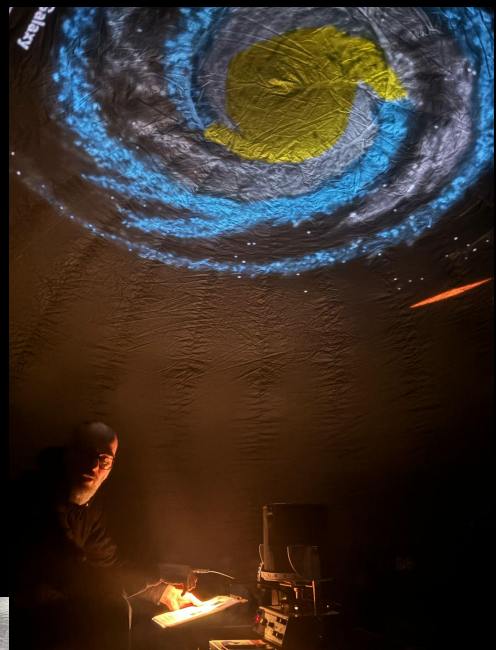

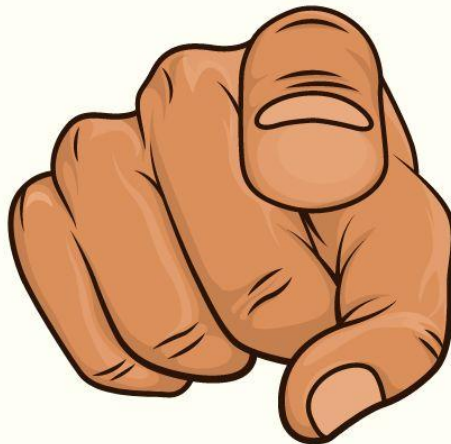
Year 5 got to experience the universe during an exciting Planetarium visit.

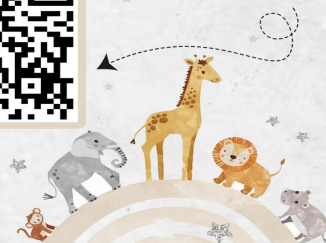

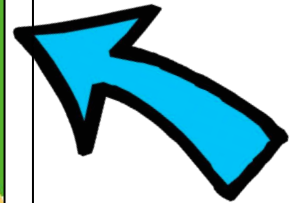

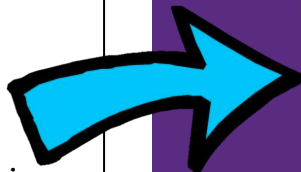
