
Anne Frank 12th June 1929 - March 1945

Writing in a diary is a really strange experience for someone like me. Not only because I've never written anything before, but also because it seems to me that later on neither I nor anyone else will be interested in the musings of a thirteen-year-old schoolgirl. Oh well, it doesn't matter. I feel like writing and I have an even greater need to get all kinds of things off my chest.


Anne Frank was born on 12th June 1929. This Wednesday would have been her 95th birthday! Anne was Jewish and lived in Germany with her mum, dad and sister, Margot. The family lived a normal life until everything changed in 1933 when the Nazi party took control of the country - they despised the Jews. Anne's family fled to the Netherlands for safety. When WW2 broke out, Europe was a dangerous place for Jewish people. Many went into hiding or fled to other countries. In 1944, the family were discovered hiding in a secret room and arrested. Anne and her sister sadly died in a concentration camp only months before the end of the war. Anne kept a diary from her 13th birthday until she was captured. Two years after the war ended, Otto (her father) published her diary. We can learn a lot about her experiences from reading this.

We have many books about Anne Frank in our school library, here are a few books you can read to find out more.


