



Whole School Reading Spine

The aim of this reading spine is to provide an extensive list of books which staff can apply to their own long-term English plans, share with children for the purposes of reading for pleasure and supplement and enhance the teaching of the foundation curriculum. These are books to use as class reads, study books for writing and whole class reading, recommendations for reading corners or for extracts (taken from them to look at in greater detail). The intention is that by the time pupils reach year 6 and beyond, they will develop a wide, rich vocabulary and broader knowledge of the world and, as a result, are able to access the more complex books expected of them in secondary schools. It should be noted that book and text selection in school not only considers narratives and poems but also recognises that a good balance of topic-appropriate non-fiction should also be read to help further develop children's background knowledge of the subject they are studying. The books have been selected to consider three areas: learning to read, access to high quality texts to enable access for all and to promote reading for pleasure and experiential and language development through information texts.

Writing/Reading stimulus books – High Quality Texts for All

These are books which will form the basis of our literature curriculum and the collection has been designed to introduce children to a growing range of texts and act as a stimulus for their own writing. They are also used as a vehicle for the teaching of reading (particularly across YR2 to YR6) as extracts or a novel study. The books contain ambitious and challenging vocabulary which will help to enrich the vocabulary our pupils are exposed to and have the chance to use. Books in this collection are likely to be:

- texts that are multi-layered - capable of being read at different levels
- books that deal with important themes
- books in which language is used in lively, inventive ways
- books by skilful and experienced children's writers and illustrators
- traditional and contemporary 'classics' of children's literature
- stories with different cultural settings
- texts that promote discussion and reflection

Foundation subject book study and supplementary texts

These books have been chosen to complement and enhance our foundation subject curriculum, staff can further supplement them with additional texts from the Schools Library Service or our own school library. Each foundation curriculum theme has a novel which class teachers can use as part of their guided or whole class reading sessions.

Whole class shared texts

These form part of our reading for pleasure collection, this is a collection of books for each year group to share and experience across the academic year. The aim is to expose children to a range of genres and themes that contain rich and challenging vocabulary and allow children to see good reading modelled by their class teacher.

Information Texts

These are high-quality information texts which are interesting and enjoyable. All the information books promote how the text and pictures can work together to provide comprehensive information and an enjoyable reading experience whilst broadening knowledge, vocabulary and experience of the world. These texts have been chosen to complement our foundation subject teaching.

Inclusive texts

These texts have been chosen to let children see their own diversity reflected in themes and characters across a variety of books. They also allow pupils to explore, discuss, challenge and reflect on their own experiences and assumptions of diversity. Inclusive texts are highlighted green on the book spine, some appear within the Reading/Writing stimulus spine, Foundation text spine and Whole class shared text spines.

Progression to independent reading

Pupils in New Brighton Primary begin their independent reading journey by accessing phonetically decodable books aligned with our phonics scheme (Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised) in school. Pupils in Foundation 2 and Year One access the text they have been learning in school when at home, as well as taking home an additional decodable text, matched to the scheme, to reinforce their phonetic knowledge.

When children move on to YR2 they are able to access our Accelerated Reading programme. Pupils who have passed their phonics screening check access colour banded books at home and Accelerated Reading books in school- accessing the colour banded books helps pupils build fluency, secure their phonics knowledge and allows class teachers to clearly track progress. Once children reach the white band and complete this, they will then progress fully on to the Accelerated Reading programme.
