Year 3	<p><u>Through the Ages</u> A study of prehistoric Britain through the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age.</p>	<p><u>Rocks, Relics and Rumbles</u> Historical study of Pompeii, paving the way for the Roman topic in Summer. Significant people: Mary Anning.</p>	<p><u>Emperors and Empires</u> A study of the Roman Empire in particular the Romanisation of Britain.</p>

Year 5	<p><u>Dynamic Dynasties</u> The history of ancient China, focusing primarily on the Shang Dynasty.</p>		<p><u>Groundbreaking Greeks</u> Covering the developments and changes over six periods of ancient Greek history.</p>
Year 6	<p><u>The Kingdom of Benin</u> This project teaches children about West Africa past and present and the development of the slave trade.</p>		<p><u>Britain at War</u> This project teaches children about the causes, events and consequences of the First and Second World Wars.</p>
