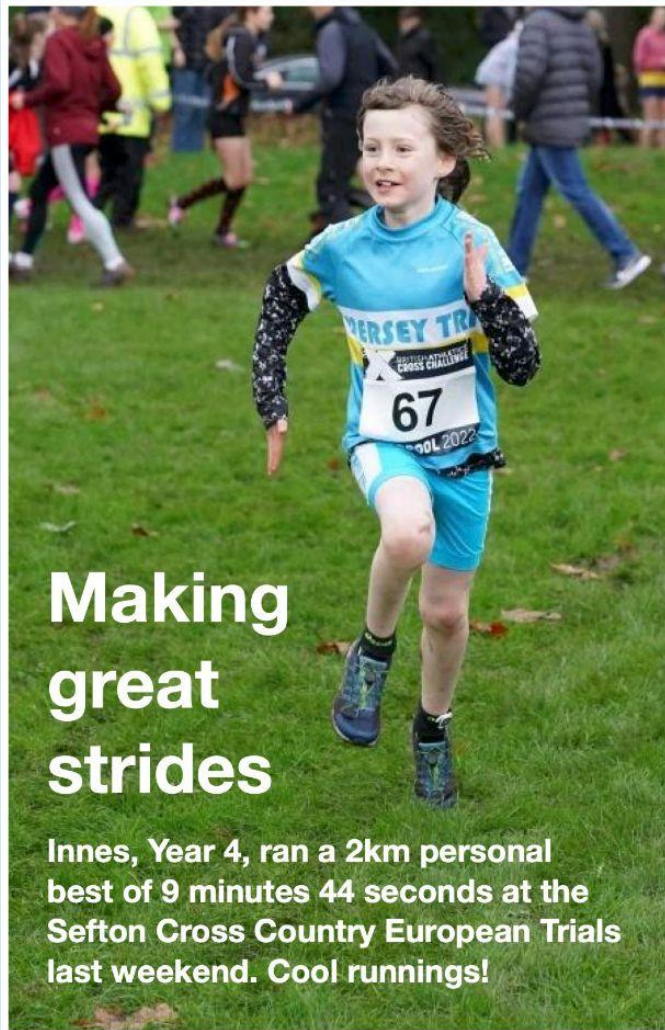
Year 1&2 pupils learned some great skills at this week's Football Festival at St George's. NBPS children learned how to dribble, pass, score and of course have fun!

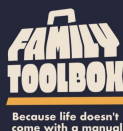
Buttercups are busily making Christmas decorations for their classroom. They are cutting, glueing and linking their paper chains with great skill.
